WE DRESS FOR SUCCESS AT CFIS

Dress codes–DOs

Shirts must be tucked in.

TITLE 1 INFORMATION

Purpose: Supplemental Education Services, focused on underachieving students, to ensure all students meet standards.

Funds: are allocated- schools are ranked based on low income status (CFIS- 62.6%)

School wide program: where funding provides additional support for students. (after school help, teacher trainings, intervention programs)

Requirements for schools- review data, teacher's professional development, parent involvement (Parent Involvement Policy, PTSA, School Site Council, ELAC)

HOW CAN PARENTS HELP?

- Provide 1-2 hours consistent study time every evening.
- Check your child's planner daily. If you sign it, your child is eligible for extra rewards.
- Have your child read for enjoyment 20-30 minutes daily.
- Monitor your child's social media, computer, television and cell phone habits.
- Let us know if your child is going through a difficult time.
