5. In 1534, this person created the Jesuits, or the Society of Jesus, to provide a strong Catholic education to boys as a way to counter the spread of Protestantism in Western Europe.
6. In 1535, this person created the Ursuline Order to provide a strong Catholic education to girls as a way to counter the spread of Protestantism in Western Europe.
7. By the mid-1500s, many of these people became missionaries around the world, spreading Roman Catholic teachings to people in Africa, Asia, North America, and South America by building mission churches and schools.
8. This person was probably the most important Roman Catholic missionary of the 1500s, helping to establish Roman Catholic churches in India and Japan.
